1. Standardised aftercare guidelines for scar models: Discussed last time – Andrea I. to work on this and send to whole group.

To be included – this can be said at the end of the session and/or given out on an information sheet according to the teachers' wishes:

Maintaining the gains you have got so far:

- The scar will have been pulling on soft tissue and affecting muscle function, so after the scar has been worked on, muscle is able to build up again and rebuild this can mean you might be more hungry than normal eat good food to support the body. Also, drink water, rest, and get good quality sleep.
- It takes up to two weeks for this integration process to take place and for more effective functioning to be restored. Too much physical exercise may well affect the results, so treat yourself gently.
- You may benefit from more ScarWork, in which case leave at least three weeks after the previous session because ScarWork seems to support the body in its self-healing. The changes often continue well after the session. Your therapist may recommend further work and explain to you why.

- 2. Finalising the last page of the manual Wolfgang
 - Candidate needs to be a member of the SW association/foundation
 - A minimum of 2 years of practice as SW practitioner
 - A minimum of 3 assistantships (of 4-day in-person workshops)
 - These 3 assistantships need to be at least with 2 different instructors (meaning not all 3 with the same instructor)
 - Instructor-Group needs to agree to certify the candidate
 - New teacher needs to organise/ present their first workshop within one year of certification
 - If this is not possible, they need to continuously co-each until their own workshop takes place.
 - Teacher certification also means, ongoing further deepening and continuing education in the field of ScarWork (e.g. surgery, post-surgery wound procedures, techniques, research)
- 3. How to become a ScarWork Instructor

Ideas were agreed in the last meeting – and need to be included in the guideline (last page under 6.) Wolfgang

- Only ScarWork Teachers who have taught at least 5 full 4-day ScarWork Workshops can become ScarWork Instructor, if they wish to.
- ScarWork Instructors can certify new SW teachers.
- The SW instructors are meeting frequently as a group to discuss new tit (teacher in training) and keep a record of their progress.
